Regular Meeting of the City Council of the City of Lindsay

Consent Agenda for 5: Motion- Klay Gilbert Second-Robert Sharp Vote- 4-0

Consider/take action any and all items relating to vacationing plat, lots 2-7, at 807 E. JM Lindsay. This property was platted in 2019 to contain 7 lots. Since the property owners of 2019 plat could not get an easement access to the newly added 6 lots, the owners are requesting the plat to be restored to the original single lot platting that was previous to the 2019 change.

Consider/take action on agreement for Fire Protection Service Contract with the Lindsay

Volunteer Fire Department. The mayor stated this is an agreement that renews yearly to provide fire protection for the city. The changes made were the dates to extend the agreement and technology expenses was increased to \$1500.00 to fund the reporting and dispatch modules. Consider/take action on any and all items relating to the Preliminary/Final Plat of 315 Hickory and 317 Walnut. After a brief discussion the council required 5.9' to be removed from the lean to allowing it to be conformant with the ordinance setback requirements. Once the lean is removed and inspection is done- the plat can be filed.

Information Report: Robert Sharp stated it was reported to him there are excessive speeders on Highway 82. It was requested by council to have the evening and weekends patrolled by the part time and reserve officers and daytime be covered during the Chief's available time.

Klay Gilbert spoke of mosquito spraying for the city. The mayor noted it was not cost effective to hire a company to spray the city. Additional there are concerns on the spray getting into animal food containers and children's outdoor toys.
